### **CPC JOINT MINISTRIES MESSAGE**

We can imagine this is the following morning of the visit of the Three Magi to the Christ Child... they came from afar, the gifts were given, wondering now what was to come?

### What is to come for us in 2025?

Epiphany Season 2025 (January 6 - March 1) offers the chance to understand Epiphany not just as a one-day event, but a process of receptivity to the Spirit, to revelation, to query, to unfolding, to perceive what is God calling us to be or do at this time.

Our conference ministry teams are aware that the November election outcomes and subsequent daily news feeds have made many of our pastors and congregants anxious and concerned about the aims and stated policies of the incoming president and his administration.

There is such uncertainty about everything and what could potentially threaten the fabric of our democracy, human rights, justice and peace making, global relationships, and the general wellbeing and safety of people.

How is this affecting you where you live, work, family and social circles, worship? What else are you feeling in your heart? What are specific issues or concerns keeping you up at night. What are you praying for? What inspiration do you have to be proactive and resourceful to make a difference where possible? We would like to know.

### **Listening Sessions to be Scheduled**

We are planning a series of listening sessions hosted by each of our ministry teams during the Epiphany season, primarily via Zoom, and perhaps a query process on paper. The sessions were affirmed by the CPCUCC Board of Directors at the December 14, 2024, meeting. Stories and info shared may affirm, inspire, inform one another, our congregations, our ministries, and conference. We will see how the Spirit moves us.

Dates still to be determined for the sessions, but they will be convened in the evenings, 6 pm Pacific time, 7 pm Mountain time in January and February, so please contact the chair of the ministry that interests you with any questions or comments.

I think of the parting words from my Unicorn Homily that speak to new beginnings, carrying this energy into 2025 and finding the sacred in the everyday...


